Firstly, we will discuss the meaning of its India and then its Latin form. Derivation meaning: Etymologically, the term Siksha has been from the Sanskrit term Shash, which means discipline, control, order, drive, decide, etc. When we don't do the right thing or disciplinary act, education makes us disciplined to control our behavior. It is also derived from the Sanskrit term Vidyā, which means knowing, i.e. knowledge; it is the acquisition of knowledge, experience and skills. The word education is derived from Latin words - Educare, Educere and Educatum, e+ duco. Educare - the term educate means to nurture, get up and feed, train or mold. The child must be weeded like a plant in the garden with a teacher. His potential must be developed through proper care and nutrition. Educare - the term educate means to drive, disappoint and raise further. The innate powers of the individual must be properly cared for and given opportunities to develop. Each child has innate powers. It must be located and provide adequate education in order to develop it. Educator – Education is something that is imposed from the outside. This is external growth through actions and experience. The teacher, through education, gives instructions and instructs to mold his abilities. E+ duco - the term E means no duco means drive. The child has inherited the opportunities, it's inborn. It should be developed, but how and what? This is possible through the education and active cooperation of the teacher. The term educate means developing latent options for children. The child does not know his potential. This is a educator who can know it and take the necessary steps to develop. Modern educational institutions widely accept the word educate. Shiksha's name derived from Shah means control or discipline. The term Vidya is derived from Vidy meaning to know. Discipline and knowledge are the most important aspect of a person's personality in the ancient period of education. Education is a process of promoting learning. Knowledge, skills, values, beliefs and habits are passed on to other people through stories, discussion, teaching, training or research. Education often takes place under the guidance of educators, but learners can also educate themselves in a process called autodidactic learning. Any experience that has a formative effect on how one thinks, feels, or actions can be seen as an education. Meaning: According to some learned people, the word Education is derived from the Latin term Educatum, which means an act of teaching or training. The education group says it comes from another Latin word, Educare, which means to nurture or raise. According to some others, the word Education comes from another Latin term Educere, which means to drive on or come out. All these meanings indicate that education seeks to feed good qualities of man and do the best in each individual. The purpose of education is to develop innate inner abilities of man.
